## **PRESIDENT'S VIEW**

Dear Members,

**Zounds!!!** We have been informed by the AAUW Washington office that our venerable Glendale branch has reached its **ninetieth year**. Yes, if you look at your Yearbook's first page you will see the date: **January 20, 1923.**



Let us take a look back at the "Roaring Twenties" when those forward thinking women had the vision to initiate our branch. Even though it was a futuristic era with broader use of new technologies - radios, telephones, motion pictures-- our founders must have been particularly strong and confident. After all, women had just given the vote on August 18<sup>th</sup>, 1920 when Tennessee became the last state to ratify the Nineteen Amendment. Also, at that time, college enrollment consisted of a predominance of upper-class males, nowhere near today's over 50% female matriculation.

In establishing our organization to empower female college graduates, our founders, dubbed as "flappers," must have endured criticism if not ridicule in some circles because of a strong belief that "a woman's place was in the home." By the end of that Jazz Age, however, one in five workers was a woman!

AAUW Washington has sent us an official letter of recognition and a certificate informing us of this historic achievement, and that document will be on display at the February Branch meeting.

Our past presidents were celebrated at our annual Founders Day at Oakmont Country Club on January 12<sup>th</sup>. We had almost all of the local past presidents in attendance, and the schedule gave everyone enough time to reminisce in between the auction for Tech Trek, a tasty lunch and the program. Our speaker Dr. Jill Kiefer gave us a perspective on possible careers for women in the arts, and she presented a slide show of outstanding female artists of this era.

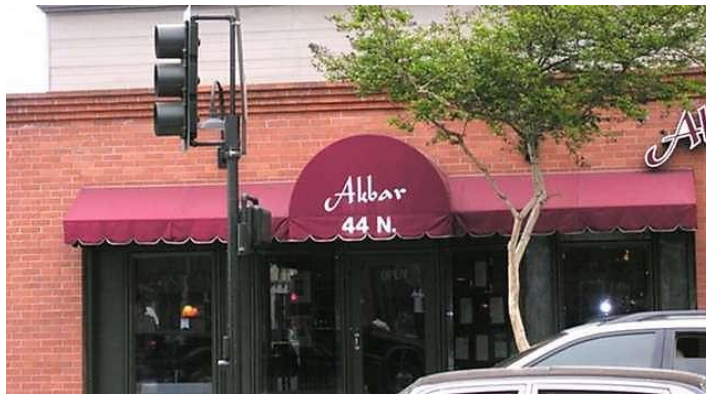
