We are honored this May 11 to have as our speaker at the branch meeting LISA SHUSTER, a 1998 graduate of Crescenta Valley High School and a student grant awardee. She will be speaking to us, to this year's student grant awardees, their school counselors, and family and friends, as well as to our TechTrek scholars. Ms Schuster became an elementary teacher in the Claremont Unified School District, after receiving her bachelor's and master's degrees from the University of California at Irvine. She teaches grades 4, 5, and 6 in a multi-age classroom and has created a program designed to ensure that these multi-stage classes meet the academic standards at each grade level. She is a team leader for the upper grades. For the last several years she has been an adjunct professor at the Claremont Graduate University where she is teaching in their teacher intern program about strategies for implementing social sciences and science curriculum. Ms Schuster's path to her current role is, of course, unique to her. However, her steps on that path and the challenges and opportunities she encountered along the way could very well be familiar to many of us. Your voting rights and procedures: The current edition of AAUW'S national OUTLOOK magazine heralds the new voting procedures in Section E -1 through E-16. AAUW members can vote online or in the mail and register their opinion on our national officers, bylaw changes, and public policy principles. (Please note your Voter PIN and Member ID on the back of this publication.) Online voting began on April 15 and continues until June 10 at the conclusion of the national convention in New Orleans. Paper ballots request period started on April 1 and those votes must be postmarked by May 17 to facilitate inclusion.

Of particular interest in the public policy position: AAUW opposes "any efforts to undermine Medicare and Medicaid, including privatization and block grant proposals."
