AAUW ANNUAL MEETING

Pat Wilson and I recently attended the AAUW Annual Meeting in Sacramento at the State Capitol Building on April 20, where 167 members attended. The State President, Alicia Hetman, emphasized the power and influence of AAUW which is demonstrated in its support of legislation affecting women, its grants and

scholarship programs, and branch programs, such as Tech Trek, Money Trek, and the Start Smart workshops. In the past year, there were 1,843 stories in major publications citing AAUW research projects. Among the many achievements of AAUW California, we are No. 1 nationally in fundraising and \$581,000 was donated to AAUW Funds from California members and branches.

One interesting fact about AAUW California is that the average age of our members is increasing. Our membership is "aging out" and our future will depend on recruitment. Our State goals are to continue to affiliate with colleges/universities and recruit more e-students. We now have over 400 e-students registered in California. It was emphasized that the use of social media websites are an important way of reaching potential new members.

The California Legislature is in high gear, moving at a faster pace in the 2013 session than in past years. Three bills opposed by AAUW CA have died in committee. You can find the status of all bills on which AAUW CA has taken positions in the Public Policy section of the website under Bill Tracking. If you haven't already signed up for Action Alerts on the aauw-ca.org website, please do so that your voice can be heard on bills of interest to AAUW members.

The next AAUW CA Conference will be held at the Los Angeles Airport Marriott on April 10, 11, 12, 2014. It should be a fun, informative, and inspirational event.

AAUW CA 2013 ELECTION RESULTS:

With 12.9 % of the AAUW CA membership voting (1563 ballots cast), these are the election results:

The Public Policy Priorities for 2013-15 were APPROVED.

The proposal to increase state dues by \$4 effective 2014-15 was PASSED.

The proposal to amend the state bylaws to reduce the number of state directors from 16 to 12 effective 2013-14 was PASSED.

Because the bylaws amendment was passed, only four directors at large were elected: Lynne Batchelor, Helene Carr, Cathy Foxhoven, Sue Miller.

The other candidates elected were Chief Financial Officer: Donna Mertens, President-Elect: Kathleen Doty.
