Women in Science ... the future



Our October brunch will feature Laura Faye Tenenbaum, an innovator in science communication. She will talk about the past, present and future of women in science.

Ms. Tenenbaum is a member of the Earth Science Communications Team at NASA's Jet Propulsion Laboratory (JPL). In that role she is responsible for creating content for the climate website "Global Climate Change: Vital Signs of the Planet." (http://climate.nasa.gov/) Her team won two Webby Awards for Best Science Website, the internet's highest honor.

Our speaker studied marine science at the University of California, Santa Cruz as both an undergraduate and graduate student. During the 90's she lived in Southeast Asia and traveled extensively. She has worked as an underwater researcher of the Kelp Forrest Project at the Monterey Bay Aquarium, as a Senior Marine Consultant for Santa Monica Baykeepers, and as an underwater Scientist for the World Wildlife Fund in Thailand. In addition, she holds a faculty position in the Physical Science Department at Glendale Community College, where she has been nominated for Adjunct Faculty of the Year.

Laura Tenenbaum's goal is to bring science, multimedia and education together to attract a highly motivated and enthusiastic new generation ready to take on the challenges we face.

AAUW PUBLIC POLICY -- Oct., 2013

Three ways to contact your representatives: google their website and send a comment; pick up the 500# phone and call, or do it the old fashioned way with an envelope, letter and your best cursive writing!

NATIONAL: "In states across the country, voting rights are under attack. Look at North Carolina, which just enacted one of the strictest voting laws: The state's own board of elections says 64 percent of the women registered to vote in North Carolina lack the required ID—which means they may have problems voting in the next election.

Our members of Congress can and should do something about state voting restrictions. The Voting Rights Act of 1965, enacted in part because of the actions of the March on Washington participants, was supposed to stop states from passing these kinds of voting restrictions. But a recent Supreme Court decision has taken most of the "meat" out of the law and left it in name only.

Tell your members of Congress: We need you to fix the Supreme Court decision and come up with a bipartisan solution to protect voting rights nationwide. Thousands of people marched for voting rights 50 years ago can you take two minutes to ask your members of Congress to protect those rights today?"

STATE: "Please help us support the efforts of Senator Steinberg and the bill sponsor, the Coalition to Abolish Slavery and Trafficking (CAST) to promote the passage of California State Senate Bill 516: Regulation of Foreign Labor Contractors to Prevent Forced Labor and Human Trafficking. This important bill passed unopposed with bi-partisan support through the California Senate and is now moving to the Assembly floor for a vote." Please support these policies by writing, calling, or e-mailing your Federal and State Representatives and Senators.
