What You Should Know about AAUW and Equal Pay Policy

The gender pay gap is a premier issue for AAUW and one that we have been working on for a long time. As early as 1922, AAUW's legislative program called for a reclassification of the U.S. Civil Service and for a repeal of salary restrictions in the Women's Bureau.

Despite the Equal Pay Act, the wage gap persists; women are typically paid just **79 cents on average for every dollar paid to men**, and that number has barely budged in a decade. Think 79 cents is bad? The pay gap is even worse for women of color. To draw attention to the gender pay gap and build support to pass the **Paycheck Fairness Act**, AAUW observes Equal Pay Day.

\$ Glendale and CA News About Income

In a recent report from Mt. St. Mary's University, Glendale women working full time made 5% more than their male counterparts. (This refers to women working full-time jobs year-round in 2014) Hooray for Glendale, but the study also reported that 24% of women older than 75 in Glendale live under the poverty line. Statewide, women made 84% on the dollar of what men made two years ago. News-Press March 3, 2016
