CALIFORNIA AND THE NATION IN A TIME OF TURMOIL. WHERE DO WE GO FROM HERE?

The shocking results of the 2016 election have turned much of conventional political analysis on its head. California, which had been at the forefront of progressive politics in a nation that seemed destined to continue in that direction, instead finds itself on the outside of national governmental power. What does this mean for such issues as climate change, health care, and immigration? And what does the increasingly divergent path of California and the Rust Belt states mean for American politics and for public policy?

What should we watching for in 2017 and beyond?

Our speaker for the February meeting is Dr. Raphael J. Sonenshein. He will address these issues in a nonpartisan fashion.

Dr. Sonenshein is the Executive Director of the Pat Brown Institute at Cal State LA., where he has served since 2012. He received his B.A. from Princeton and his Ph.D. from Yale. He is the author of three books on Los Angeles politics and government. His book Politics in Black and White: Race and Power in Los Angeles (Princeton U. Press 1993) won the 1994 Ralph M. Bunche Award from the American Political Science Association as the best political science book of the year in the field of racial and cultural pluralism. Dr. Sonenshein served as Executive Director of the Los Angeles (Appointed) Charter Reform Commission between 1997 and 1999, and as Executive Director of the Los Angeles Neighborhood Council Review Commission. He was Best Educator and Distinguished College Faculty Member at CSU Fullerton, where he taught for 29 years and received a Wang Family Excellence Award as one of the four best faculty members in the CSU system. He was one of two co-winners of the Havnes Foundation Research Impact award and received the Harry Scoville award in 2012 from the Los Angeles chapter of the American Society of Public Administration. Dr. Sonenshein was the fall 2008 Fulbright Tocqueville Distinguished Chair in American politics and taught at the University of Paris.


