CAN POETRY KEEP YOU YOUNG? "SCIENCE IS STILL OUT, BUT THE HEART SAYS YES"

This was the title of the National Public Radio segment broadcast on the "Morning" Edition" on February 20, 2017 which introduced Dr. Janet Hoult's poetry workshop held in the Culver City Senior Center. This place is where older adults (the oldest pupil is 91 years old) meet once a week to read and listen to poems of fellow group members under the leadership of Dr. Hoult who strives to improve their poetry.

Dr. Hoult retired in 2000 after an illustrious career as a professor and administrator at the University of Southern California and California State University Los Angeles. She also taught as a Fulbright Fellow and lecturer around the world. As a retiree she is very active in the Culver City community and in the Cal State University Emeriti Association.

Janet started her poetry writing in 1999 after her son was killed in a traffic accident. "Poetry helped me focus on how I felt about losing my son" she says, "when you lose, you also remember what you had before the loss and it allows you to look at a relationship, at what was of value to you".

Janet published her first book of poems about aging "Body Parts" (it won a Reader's Favorite Award in 2010). It was followed by "Where Did theSun Go?" Myths and Legends of Solar Eclipses which won the same award in 2013, and "Body Language" another collection of poems about aging which was published in 2015. Dr. Janet Hoult is currently the Culver City Poet Laureate which is an honorary and unpaid position.
