WHY JOIN AAUW?

Part One of a Three Part Membership Series By Beverly Van Citters, Membership VP

How many different organizations do we join in a lifetime? I could not find any data to support that question but I thought about clubs or organizations I joined from childhood to the present. I counted over 50 different clubs or organizations, religious, social, political, special interest, etc. I joined AAUW over 36 years ago in 1980. I felt a reaction, perhaps to the women's movement; I needed to be a part of something larger and to bring visibility of women's issues to others.

I did not know that AAUW would help to give me the skills necessary as a newly minted yet untenured faculty member to stand up to leaders at a private university where a male, without a Ph.D., was paid more than me [with a Ph.D.]! The reason for the pay variance, I was told, was that he had a family and I did not. As a single woman, who supported a widowed mother, I did not comprehend nor accept that reasoning. After seeking counsel, I investigated EEOC [Equal Employment Opportunity Commission] and learned the law governing my employment. I explained the law to my supervisors and discussed the ramifications if the law was not followed. I successfully renegotiated my contract, received back pay and much later, did receive tenure with a promotion. Without AAUW and my AAUW mentors and peers, my situation would have remained unchanged. Pay equity is only one of many issues AAUW supports.

AAUW is made up of volunteers who believe in its vision and mission. We are united in believing the AAUW Vision: We bring people together for the common goal of breaking through educational and economic barriers for women and girls. We are united in the message of the mission: Advancing equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy, and research. In our local branch, we have members who are mentors, professionals, local activists, politicians, leaders, mothers, daughters, grandmothers and friends, each with a story to tell.

What is your story? What has AAUW done for you? Reflect on why you joined and what makes you stay. How might you explain your reason for being a member to a visitor attending our branch meeting?
